We are proud to launch ARTY – Artistic Resonance for Thriving Youth, an Erasmus+ KA154-YOU project dedicated to empowering young people through creativity, inclusion, and psychosocial wellbeing. ARTY responds to the EU Youth Strategy 2019–2027 and directly supports Youth Goal #10: A Sustainable and Green Europe and Youth Goal #3: Inclusive Societies.

The project promotes the transformative power of artistic expression as a catalyst for youth empowerment, intercultural dialogue, and social connection. By combining arts-based methods, non-formal education, and community participation, ARTY offers young people innovative ways to express themselves, overcome barriers, and strengthen emotional resilience.

Through a series of creative workshops, training activities, and international exchanges, ARTY creates spaces where art becomes both a tool for learning and a pathway to wellbeing, helping youth turn imagination into action for positive social change.



PROJECT GOALS

Empowering Young People through Art

- Supporting young people to use creativity as a means of self-expression, emotional wellbeing, and civic engagement.

Promoting Inclusion and Diversity

- Ensuring that youth with fewer opportunities gain equal access to creative learning environments and cross-cultural experiences.

Building Creative Competences and Soft Skills

- Developing confidence, empathy, teamwork, and intercultural understanding through participatory art practices.

Strengthening Youth Work and Innovation

- Equipping youth workers, educators, and artists with inclusive tools and methodologies for arts-based education and empowerment.

Fostering Community Participation

- Encouraging collaboration between youth, local stakeholders, and institutions through public art, exhibitions, and social campaigns.

PROJECT ACTIVITIES

- Local Creative Workshops (in all partner countries)
 - Young people explore painting, theatre, movement, and storytelling to express emotions, address social issues, and build confidence.
- Transnational Youth Exchange
 - A week-long creative mobility bringing together young participants from Greece, Germany, Romania, and North Macedonia. The exchange promotes intercultural dialogue and shared artistic creation, culminating in a collective art performance.
- Training Course for Youth Workers and Artists
 - An intensive programme equipping facilitators with the ARTY methodology — combining non-formal education, art therapy techniques, and creative reflection tools to support inclusion and wellbeing.
- Creative Modules Development
 - Partners co-create three thematic modules — Art & Empowerment, Art & Civic Engagement, and Community Art & Collaboration — each tested through local piloting activities.
- Local Dissemination Events and Exhibitions
 - Each partner organises public presentations and community exhibitions to share project results, celebrate participants' work, and promote art as a tool for social change.
