PROJECT OBJECTIVES

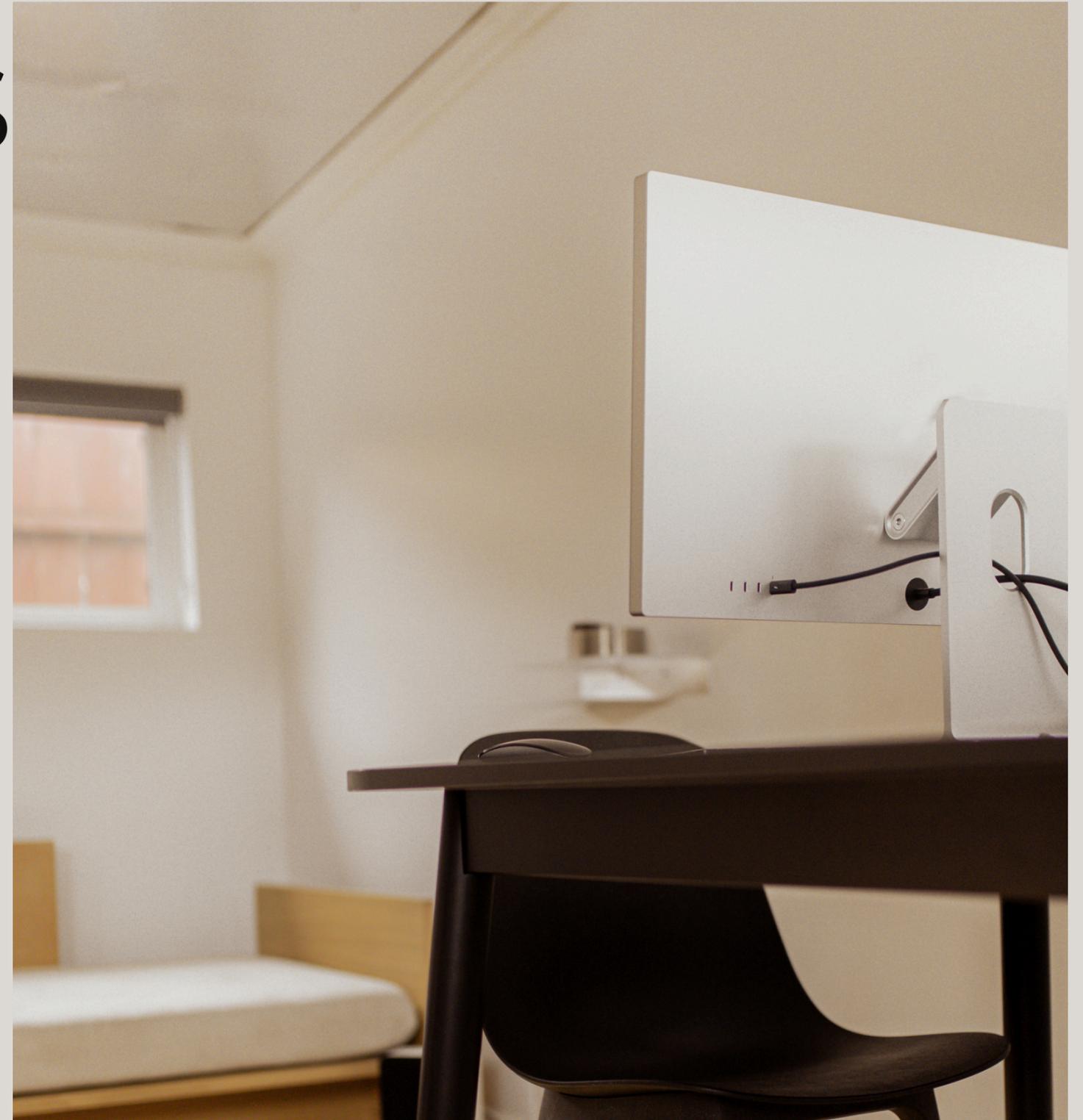
- Encourage youth to take leadership roles in creative and community projects.

- Link art-based learning with real-world project management and event organization

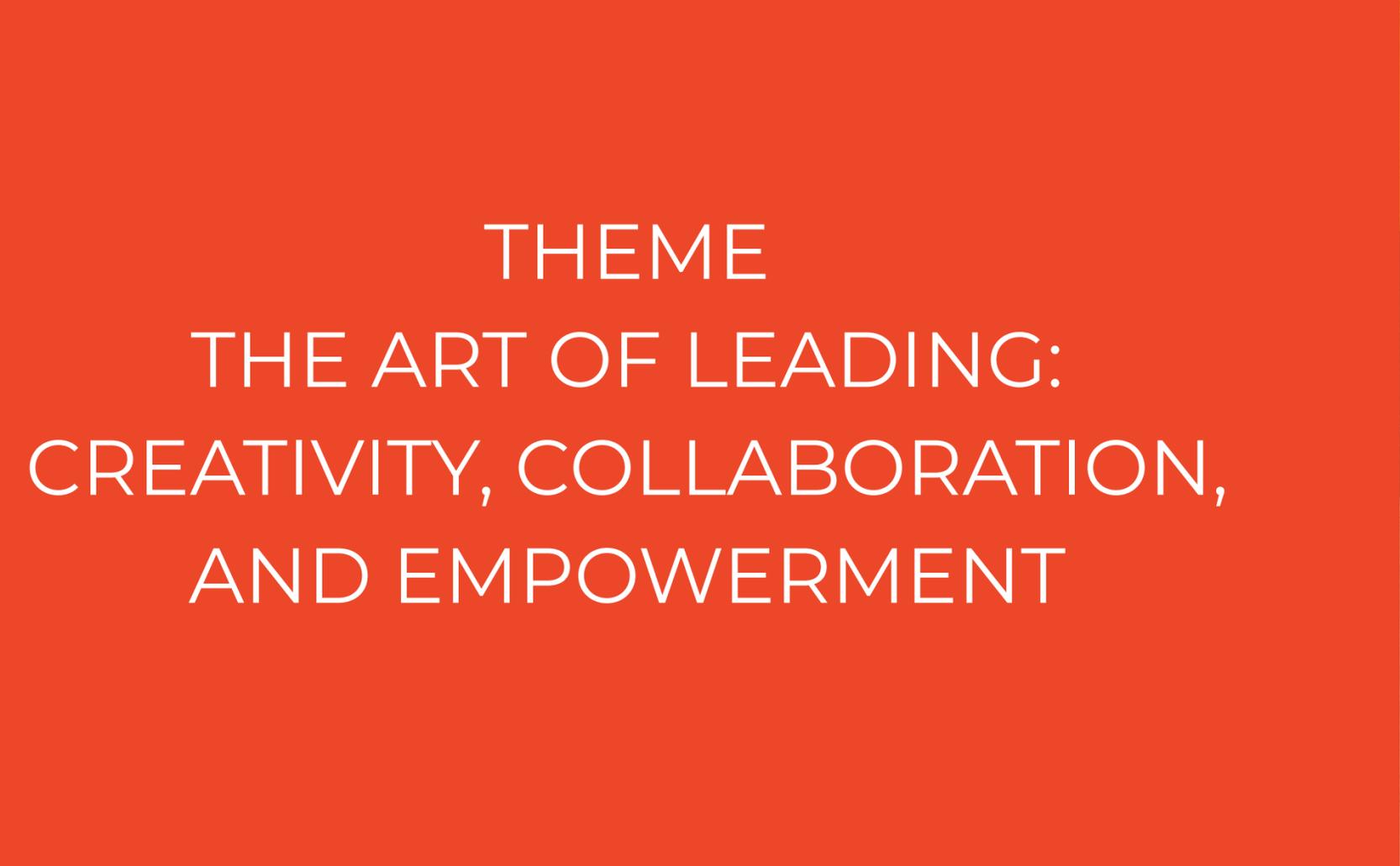




EXPECTED RESULTS

- Empowered young leaders who guide others through creativity and empathy.



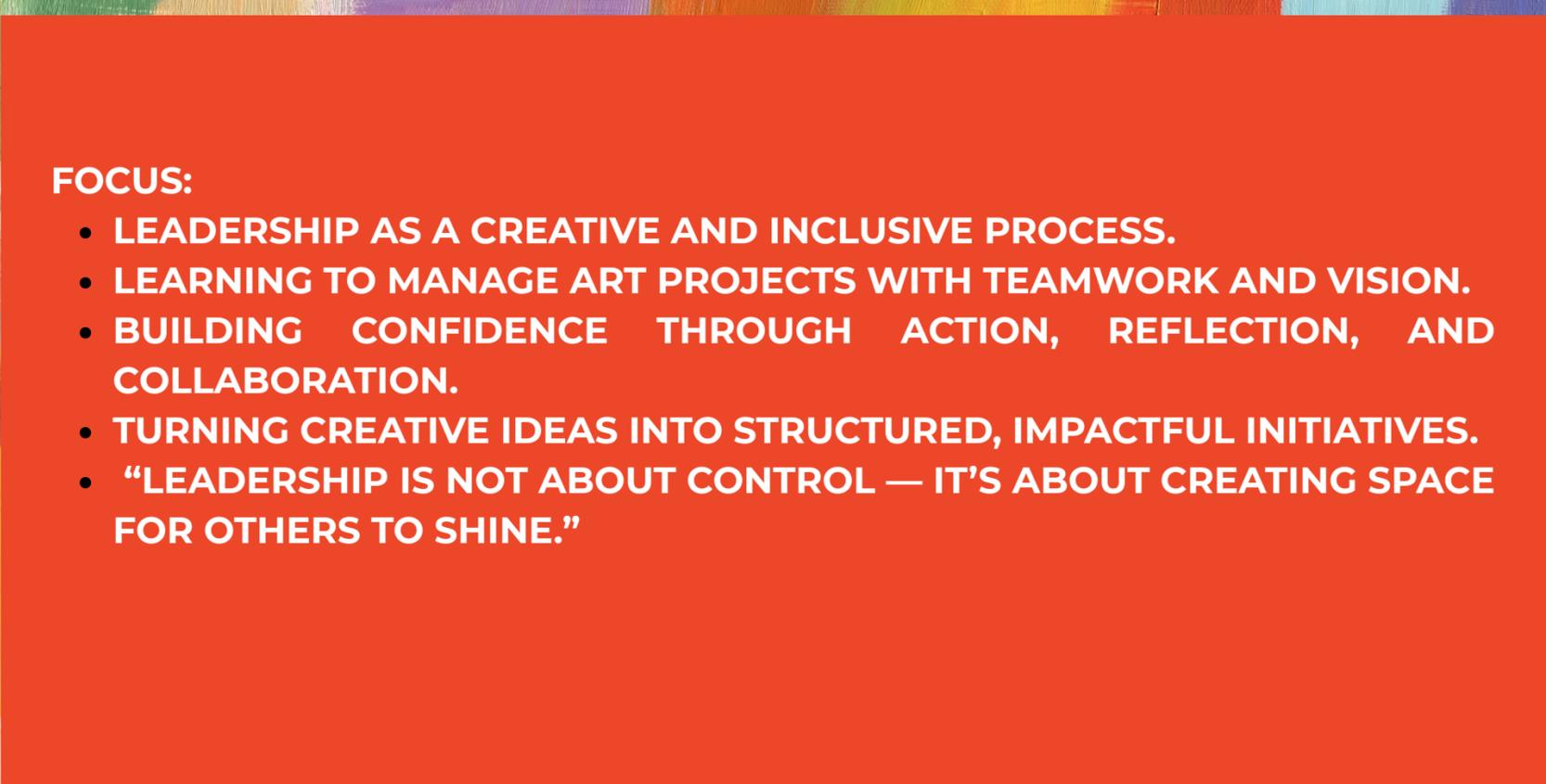

EMPOWERS YOUTH TO DESIGN, COORDINATE, AND EVALUATE THEIR OWN COMMUNITY ART INITIATIVES.





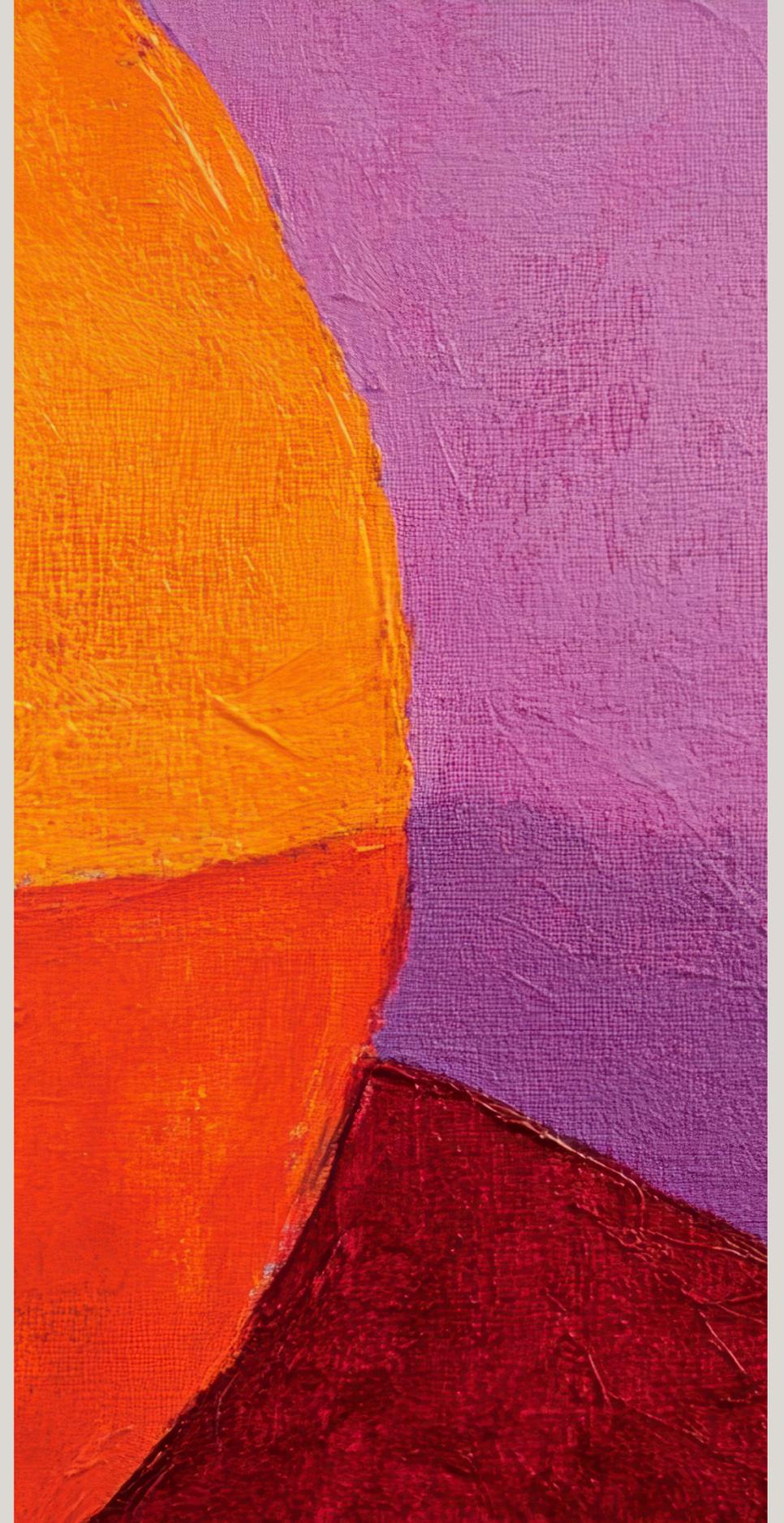
GOALS OF THE MODULE

- STRENGTHEN PARTICIPANTS' LEADERSHIP, PLANNING, AND COMMUNICATION SKILLS.
- INSPIRE YOUTH TO TAKE INITIATIVE AND GUIDE GROUP PROJECTS.
- FOSTER TEAMWORK AND MUTUAL TRUST THROUGH COLLABORATIVE CHALLENGES.
- TEACH PRACTICAL METHODS OF EVENT PLANNING AND CREATIVE PROJECT MANAGEMENT.
- ENCOURAGE REFLECTION ON PERSONAL LEADERSHIP STYLE AND GROUP DYNAMICS.



SKILLS DEVELOPED

- Participants will strengthen their :
 1. Leadership & Responsibility – guiding teams with vision, empathy, and initiative.
 2. Project & Event Management – planning, organizing, and implementing ideas.
 3. Teamwork & Communication – coordinating roles and fostering collaboration.
 4. Creative Thinking & Adaptability – solving challenges through innovation.
 5. Self-Reflection & Mentoring – understanding leadership strengths and areas to grow.





KEY ACTIVITIES

- Simulation: Organizing a Mini Art Festival
- Participants work in teams to plan, design, and present a small-scale festival or exhibition.
- Focus: leadership, logistics, creativity, and collaboration.
- Team Project Planning Challenge
- Groups design project proposals addressing real community needs through art.
- Outcome: practice in budgeting, scheduling, and delegation.
- Peer Mentoring & Reflection Circles
- Structured discussions and feedback exchanges on leadership experiences.
- Goal: enhance empathy, communication, and shared learning.

GUIDING QUESTIONS FOR PARTICIPANTS

- What does leadership mean to me — and how do I express it creatively?
- How can we lead without excluding anyone's voice?
- What makes a project successful: the plan, the people, or the purpose?
- How can I help others grow while growing myself?

Outcome:

- Participants redefine leadership as a collaborative, creative, and empowering act.



METHODOLOGY

Approach: Experiential learning through simulation, collaboration, and reflection.

Combines hands-on planning with creativity, teamwork, and personal growth.

Pedagogical Basis:

- Learning-by-doing and real-world application.
- Co-creation and participatory leadership models.
- Reflection on emotions, teamwork, and responsibility.
- Emphasis on empowerment, inclusivity, and shared success.



CREATIVE PROCESS STEPS

1. Inspiration Phase

Explore stories of young creative leaders and community-driven art projects.

Brainstorm: "What kind of leader do I want to be?"

2. Creation Phase

Teams plan and simulate leading an art event or creative initiative. Develop schedules, roles, communication plans, and promotional ideas.

3. Sharing Phase

Presentation of mini-festival plans or project pitches to the group/community.

4. Reflection Phase

Peer feedback, mentoring, and personal reflection on leadership experience.





OUTCOMES PER ACTIVITY

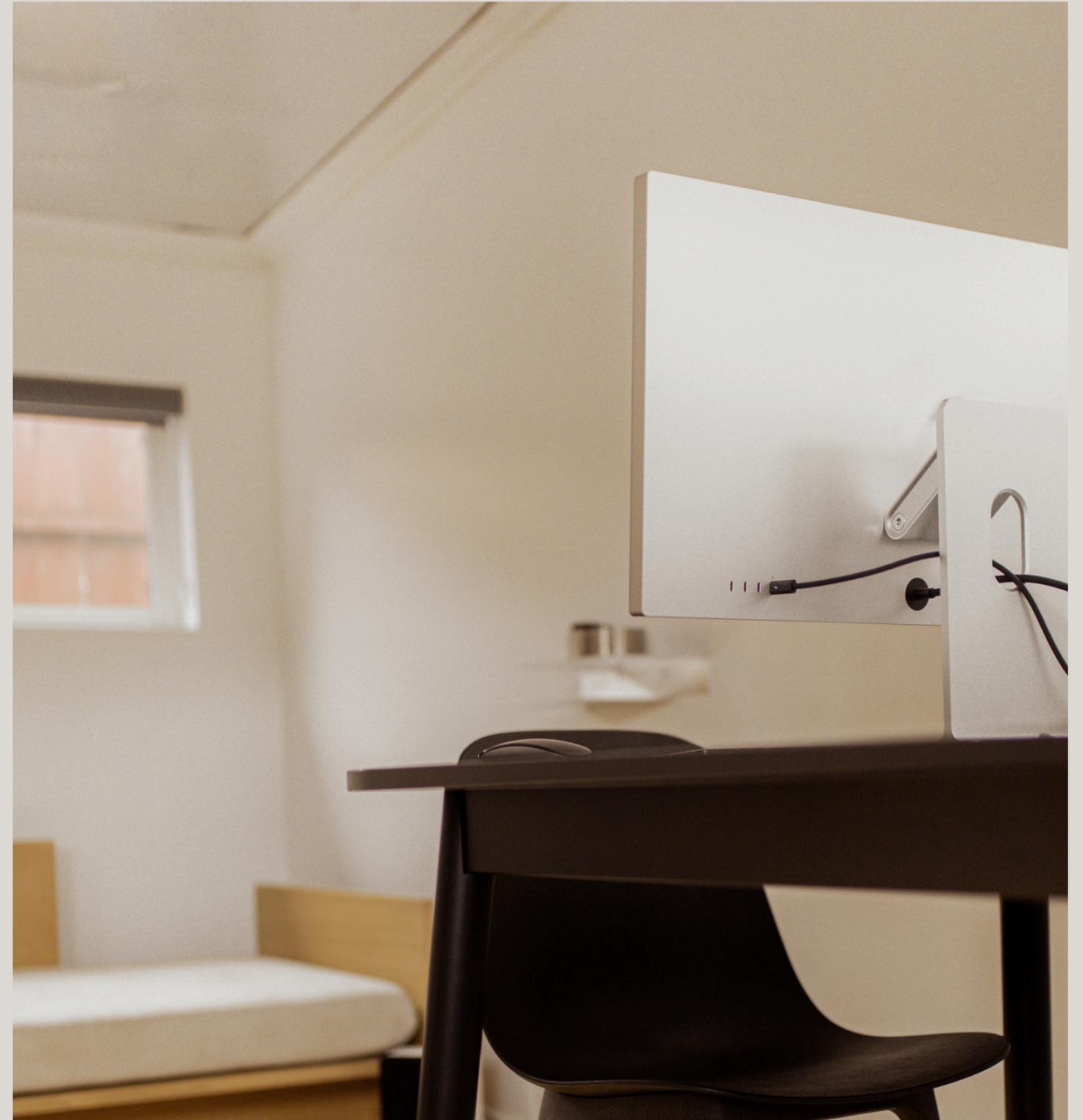
Mini Art Festival Simulation for Improved leadership and event management skills.

Team Planning Challenge for Stronger collaboration, problem-solving, and organization.

Reflection Circles for Deepened empathy, communication, and self-awareness.

Overall Impact:

Participants discover that leadership is not about hierarchy — it's about connection, vision, and trust.



ROLE OF PARTICIPANTS AND PARTICIPANTS: FACILITATORS

- TAKE INITIATIVE AND LEAD PROJECT TEAMS.
- PRACTICE RESPONSIBILITY, ACTIVE LISTENING, AND DELEGATION.
- COLLABORATE, MOTIVATE, AND SUPPORT PEERS.
- REFLECT ON THEIR GROWTH AS CREATIVE LEADERS.
- “A GREAT LEADER DOESN’T STAND IN FRONT — THEY STAND BESIDE.”

FACILITATORS:

- Encourage active participation and inclusive leadership.
- Guide the project management process and ensure balanced teamwork.
- Provide tools for effective organization and conflict resolution.
- Inspire reflection on emotional intelligence and empathy in leadership.

↳ TOOLS & MATERIALS

- Project Planning Tools: templates, calendars, budgeting sheets.
- Creative Materials: posters, markers, digital design tools.
- Digital Tools: Trello, Canva, Miro, Google Workspace.
- Presentation Equipment: microphones, screens, cameras for documentation.
- Learning Space: flexible setup for teamwork, discussion, and presentations.





EVALUATION & REFLECTION

Purpose:

To evaluate personal and group leadership development through creative collaboration.

Methods:

- Reflection Journals – insights on leadership experiences.
- Group Debriefs – what worked, what challenged us, what we learned.
- Peer Feedback – supportive observations from teammates.
- Documentation – photos or videos of teamwork and outcomes.

Goal:

To strengthen awareness of emotional, organizational, and creative leadership dimensions.



IMPACT ON PARTICIPANTS

Increased leadership confidence and responsibility.

- Improved teamwork and planning abilities.
- Stronger sense of collaboration and trust.
- Ability to transform creative ideas into organized actions.
- Development of empathy and communication in leadership roles.
- “I learned that leading is not telling others what to do — it’s inspiring them to create.”





EMOTIONAL LEARNING THROUGH ART

Title: Leading with Heart and Vision

Participants connect leadership with emotion, imagination, and empathy. They realize that guiding others creatively requires both courage and care. Art-based leadership becomes a journey of self-discovery and shared empowerment.

“When I lead creatively, I don’t just manage — I inspire.”

FOLLOW-UP & SUSTAINABILITY

Next Steps:

- Apply leadership skills in real community or school art projects.
- Develop youth-led initiatives or local creative events.
- Create a mentorship chain between experienced and new participants.
- Integrate creative leadership practices into future training modules.

Long-Term Vision:

To foster a generation of empathetic, creative, and proactive young leaders.

To ensure that leadership remains an art — rooted in collaboration, inclusion, and imagination.
